## Italy Softball Tour Itinerary

July 19 – 29, 2026

USAAI Softball | Cultural Exploration | Team Connections

### **Sunday, July 19 – Milan (2 nts)**

Depart from the United States (JFK) on an overnight flight bound for Milan (MXP). During the flight, both dinner and breakfast will be served, ensuring a comfortable start to your journey.

### **Monday, July 20 – Milan – Cultural Exploration**

Arrive in the morning at Milan Malpensa Airport. Upon arrival, you will meet your USAAI tour manager and transfer into the city. Lunch is on your own. We will hit the ground running with a tour of the Milan Cathedral (Duomo) and its rooftop terraces, followed by viewing Leonardo da Vinci's "Last Supper" at the Convent of Santa Maria delle Grazie. After the tour we will check into the hotel and take time to refresh for dinner. Then return to your hotel for a well-deserved rest.

### **Tuesday, July 21 – Milan - Cultural Exploration & Softball Competition in Milan (1 nt)**

Start the day with breakfast at your hotel. Next, embark on a walking tour of Milan. Sites include Piazza della Scala, Piazza Duomo, Museo del Novecento, Sforzesco Castle, Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, Parco Sempione, Piazza degli Affari, and the Verziere Column. Lunch is on your own. Take some time to explore Milan and do some souvenir shopping. Return to the hotel and relax before our first softball game. (opponent to be determined) Dinner provided.

### **Wednesday, July 22 – Milan – Parma (4 nts)**

Enjoy a late breakfast at the hotel, before departing for Parma, Italy for the 39<sup>th</sup> Due Torri Tournament & 21<sup>st</sup> "Mario Bacchi Stefani" Memorial Event. Technical meetings and player registration begin at 6:00 pm in the press room, followed by dinner. Opening ceremonies start at 8:00 pm with team presentations, national anthems, welcome speeches from the mayor of Parma and the FIBS President, and live music by Giorgia Camurati. Return to hotel for the night.

### **Thursday, July 23 – Torneo Due Torri & Maria Bacchi Stefani Memorial Tournament**

Begin with breakfast at the hotel. Tournament begins at 8:30 am (field location and opponent tba). Lunch will be on your own. After lunch, tournament play continues. Dinner at 5:00pm, with entertainment starting at 6:00pm. Homerun derby begins at 8:00pm, after which DJ SET with TIGA will entertain the participants. Return to the hotel.

### **Friday, July 24 – Torneo Due Torri & Maria Bacchi Stefani Memorial Tournament cont.**

After breakfast at the hotel. Tournament continues at 8:30 am (field location and opponent tba). Lunch will be on your own, tournament play continues. Dinner at 5:00pm, with entertainment starting at 6:00pm. After dinner stay and enjoy the festivities at the complex. Return to the hotel.

**Saturday, July 25 – Torneo Due Torri & Maria Bacchi Stefani Memorial Tournament cont.**

Have breakfast at the hotel. After breakfast at the hotel. Tournament continues at 8:30 am (field location and opponent tba). Lunch will be on your own, tournament play continues. Dinner at 5:00pm, with entertainment starting at 6:00pm. After dinner stay and enjoy the festivities at the complex. Return to the hotel.

**Sunday, July 26 – Torneo Due Torri & Maria Bacchi Stefani Memorial Tournament finals**

Start the day with breakfast at the hotel. Participate in the finals of the tournament. (schedule tba) Closing Ceremonies will take place following the championship game. Depart by private coach to Rome, a trip of approximately 5.5 hours. Upon arrival, check into our hotel and relax. Dinner at a local restaurant.

**Monday, July 27 – Rome - Cultural Exploration**

After breakfast at the hotel. Over the next two days you'll get the chance to see some of Rome's greatest sites first-hand. Day One: Colosseum, Roman Forum & Palatine Hill, Lunch on our own. After lunch, Via Dei Fori Imperiali, Altar of the Fatherland, Piazza Navona and the Spanish Steps. Dinner provided.

**Tuesday, July 28 – Rome - Cultural Exploration**

After breakfast at the hotel. Day Two: Vatican City. Lunch on our own. After lunch, take a scenic walk along Tiber River, finish at the Borghese Gallery. Free time and dinner. Return to the hotel and pack for your journey home.

**Wednesday, July 29 – Departure from Rome**

Enjoy breakfast at the hotel before transferring to Rome Fiumicino Airport (FCO) for your return flight home. Wishing you safe travels and unforgettable memories!

## **What's NOT Included in the Cost of the Trip**

- Connecting airline ticket to gateway city.
- Fuel Surcharges instituted by the airlines.
- Passport fees. A passport is required, begin the application process as soon as possible.
- Visa fees (if applicable).
- Individual medical insurance. Check with your insurance carrier for coverage.
- Customary tipping (Bus drivers) Collected 2 weeks prior to the departure.
- Laundry – laundry for the athletic gear is available for a fee.
- Travel insurance (Recommended).
- Personal items such as gifts, telephone calls, snacks, drinks, etc.

Team members are responsible for raising or paying \$5,425 to cover their share of the team's expenses as set forth by the NCAA, NAIA, & NJCAA with respect to the Foreign Tours guidelines.
